STANDING ORDER

Standing Order No.: 2022-01

Due to continual risks associated with COVID-19 and the need to assure the safety and well-being of the Yurok community, the Yurok Tribal Court issues the following Standing Order.

The Yurok Justice Center will remain open to the public for business purposes. The Court is taking a preventative approach to protecting those accessing the Justice Center. Bearing that in mind, the Court makes the following orders:

The Court orders that people and staff attending Court hearings **must** at all times wear a proper face mask in the Courtroom unless actively appearing (speaking to the Court) on a case. The Courtroom shall at no time have more than 11 people in the room which includes tribal staff, case parties, and members of the public. Court hearings will continue to be held over zoom for case parties that want to have the option of appearing remote. All case parties that want to appear for a hearing remotely **must** file a Request to Appear by Video Conference at least three (3) business days before the scheduled court hearing. You may also contact the Clerk's Office for any questions or filing purposes. This Standing Order will remain in effect until properly rescinded by the Chief Judge.

The Court will continue to monitor COVID-19 concerns and update the public accordingly.
